So, what has been happening for FOPP in the last six months or so?

We were very pleased to receive money from the prison which meant our play-worker was able to have her contract renewed until the end of August 2018. Kim has now been with us for two and a half years and is very much appreciated by residents, families and prison personnel. The FOPP Annual meeting was held in October when Damian Evans, prison director, addressed us on developmental plans for the prison including plans to increase the number of remand prisoners later this year. It was heartening for the volunteers to realise how much the director and senior management also value what FOPP does.

I am writing this piece just before the Annual FOPP Christmas meal, once again to be held at the Woodman pub. This is usually an enjoyable event and, hopefully, will be again this year so that by the time you read this you will agree that it was!!

There have been two new board members joining us since the last newsletter. Charles Hooper, for several years an education volunteer and David Hobbs who undertakes the role of story books mums and dads. They are both tremendous assets to the FOPP Board of Directors having taken on the role with commitment and enthusiasm injecting new ideas/ways of looking at issues. However, things are for ever changing and just as two new people join us, two of the existing team are leaving. Jenny Pardoe decided to leave us. Jenny has been a director for several years acting as meetings secretary, also undertaking the line management role for Kim, the playworker. Jenny kept us up to speed with safeguarding issues and has always been willing to work on small sub committees to sort out various issues. FOPP will miss her a lot.

I have also decided it is time to move on having been chairman for 11 years, joining FOPP very soon after the opening of HMP Peterborough. I have just completed Autumn and we are now in the mad frenzy of Christmas. The children appear to enjoy this part of the year more than any other !!!!!!!

This year I decided to do activities on a weekly basis. We started at the end of November with advent so we made advent calendars & coloured in advent pictures. Smoke free prison

As of January 29th 2018 both sides of the prison will be smoke free.

Just a reminder that as of 11 September 2017 cigarettes, tobacco and lighters are prohibited items and are not to be bought into the prison.

Anyone who wishes to smoke must leave any cigarettes, tobacco and lighters outside the establishment and use the allocated smoking area only - the smoking shelter located in the staff car park. Smoking is not permitted in any other location
